- Accreditation Committee Works with NFCA's SFRM, IFRM Contractor Accreditation Program and also the UL Qualified SFRM Fireproofing Contractor Program.
- Technical Code & Standards Committee This committee provides input to ASTM and UL, other standards developers inputting important field perspectives to the process.
- **Technical Education Committee** This new committee is just getting started. The future education for project managers, estimators, workforce, are targets.
- **Program Committee** NFCA's Conference topics and locations are decided by this committee, and NFCA's staff.

NFCA Board – <u>NFCA's Board of Director</u> volunteers their time and talent to help steer the NFCA's direction. We have met virtually in December and February to review where we are, and look forward into '22's actions for the association, and the industry. When you see Board Members at the NFCA's Week of Learning Education Conference, thank them. Consider joining a committee, then maybe even running for the Board of Directors. Your investment in volunteer time pays dividends – personally and professionally.

NFCA's Standards – **NFCA 100, 200, 300, 400**, were developed to provide 3rd party resources for contractors and others to use when educating staff? When proving a point to a customer or inspector? Check the standards out!

NFCA's Executive Director, Bill McHugh & NFCA Consultant, Rich Walke, have been advocating on behalf of the fireproofing industry this month. We submitted code proposals to the State of Florida's code development process – proposing that special inspection of fireproofing be part of the FL Building Code. We attended several ICC Fire Code Action Committee Meetings, to be sure ASTM E119 and UL 263 are the basis for fire-resistance design. Watch for more as activities unfold.

NFCA VIRTUAL Education & Exams – NFCA conducted another successful VIRTUAL IFRM & SFRM Fireproofing Education and Exams with for 10 individuals – who passed and are now eligible to become NFCA and UL DRI's. We also had one special inspector who took the class and can now show competence through the NFCA's Certificate. The next NFCA IFRM & SFRM Education and Exams course offering in person during the Week of Learning April 18-20, 2022

NFCA @ ICC Code Development Process – The International Building Code Administrative and Structural Chapters are to be debated at ICC's Committee Action Hearings in Rochester, NY in Late March, early April. We'll attend and provide input in both chapters. Visit www.ICCSafe.org to watch the hearings LIVE March 28-April 11.

NFCA @ **ASTM** -NFCA provided input to the new ASTM Standard for Inspecting Boards and Wraps used for Fireproofing. A ballot is out currently for that standard, and two others on SFRM and IFRM. Watch for more on these standards as the year progresses.

NFCA @ UL/ULC STP – The ULC Standards Technical Panel met for the first time in several years. We were glad to participate, and look forward to working with the new Primary Development Engineer for Fire-Resistance, Kevin Hyland. Kevin will participate at NFCA's Week of Learning too.

SAFETY SECTION:

Fireproofing Hose Whip Restraints - If a hose connection is pressurized and its failure could cause a hazardous situation, it is required to have a "hose whip check". The requirements for these Hose Whips is found in OSHA 29CFR 1926.603. While the reference is for pile driving equipment, the standard can apply to fireproofing hoses under pressure as well. References can also be found in the US Army Corps of Engineers document 1.G.02 and 20.A.02.



The Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety (CCOHS) makes reference to a <u>mechanical means of securing hose connections</u>.

As many fireproofing contractor pump pressures have increased in the past few years, checking these whip check devices on projects is a good way to ensure that the contractor is in compliance. Complying with many of these CCOHS and OSHA standards, or other documents, and also help to ensure the safety of our employees.
